

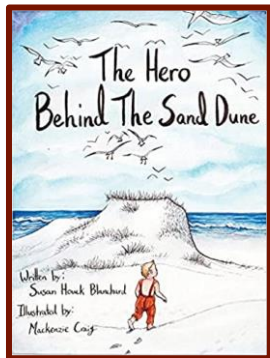

At Your Fingertips

Have you ever strolled through a beautiful garden and wondered, “What kind of flower is that?” If you have, we hope you come join us for a promenade that includes answers.

That’s right! We are currently creating our “Core Sound Butterfly and Pollinator Garden” which will be an interactive garden walk experience for you to enjoy. Our beautiful plants are labeled with their names and a QR code for scanning will be added to each placard in time for spring blooms! Simply scan the barcode with your cell phone and enter a digital world of information about the flower you are standing before in real life.

With the help of Carolyn Hoss and intern Larrington Chadwick, pictures of our beautiful garden are being identified and linked to an online plant database. They will appear on your phone clockwise from where you scan the code. Meander up and down the sidewalk and even onto our deck. As you see the wide variety of pollinators and native plants, you can check your phone to learn more about each one! Information such as bloom time, soil type, and more will be at your fingertips. We hope to continue this with our wetland garden and rain garden in the future. Visit each season to see what is in bloom and spend time admiring the hard work and dedication our Master Gardeners put into maintaining our grounds.
